INTERVENTION EARLY INTERVENTION PREVENTION

Out of School Care

- Licensed quality, affordable, afterschool child care for ages 5-12 including day camps for non-instructional school days and summer.
- Programming follows emergent curriculum that supports skill development, promotes positive values and attitudes, enhances children's self-esteem, and builds resiliency.

Early Learning & Child Care Centre

- Licensed, quality, affordable child care for ages 1-6 that responds to each family's needs.
- Program delivery incorporates the Alberta Early Learning and Child Care Curriculum Framework.

Youth Development Programs

- **Leadership Development:** Torch (ages 10-13) and Keystone (ages 14-18) programs focus on five core areas: leadership, teamwork, learning for life, volunteering, and healthy choices.
- **Kid Food Nation:** Kids will develop food skills through hands-on experiences of planning, preparing, and cooking (ages 7-12).
- **Thrive** - Activity based social emotional learning to enhance wellness (ages 13-18).
- **Youth Drop-In** - Youth socialization through games, activities, crafts, music, and more (ages 13-18).
- **Respect2Connect** – Tools and techniques to develop and sustain healthy relationships (ages 13-15).

Mâdawipayiwîn

- Mâdawipayiwîn, the Cree word for togetherness, supports children, youth, and families to become actively involved in a cultural life by increasing the number of Indigenous experiences offered during program delivery.

Youth Leading Reconciliation

- Engaging Indigenous and non-Indigenous youth in a dialogue about Truth and Reconciliation which will explore ways to be allies, agents, and advocates for reconciliation work (ages 13-24).

Raise the Grade

- After-school academic program that encourages youth ages 12-19 to explore their interests, access homework support with mentors/tutors, increase digital literacy, and explore post-secondary/career options.

Stars Mentoring Program

- In-school mentoring that matches children with screened, supportive, and caring role models.

Family Resource Network Hub

- A collaborative approach to receive and respond to referrals, and support children and youth 0-18, parents, caregivers, and families to access a variety of programs within the community.
- The Hub coordinates and collaborates with community partners to ensure that they receive appropriate referrals, relevant information, and that families are supported in accessing and registering in prevention and early intervention programs.

Enrichment Program

- In-home parenting education, solution-focused counselling, and family support services for families whose children are 7-18 years of age and directly for youth.
- Assists with reducing risks and building protective factors that impact and improve personal and family functioning, develop a safe, nurturing environment for children, and increase healthy child development and resiliency.

Family Support Program

- Family and Youth Support Work, Supervised Visitation, and Drives in a safe, supportive environment to ensure the emotional and physical well-being of children, youth, and families in the community, family home, or Visitation Centre.
- Information, knowledge, and community connections, through individualized program plans to support the development of skills to preserve, restore, and enhance personal and family functioning.
